### Company Overview

### Team Qualifications

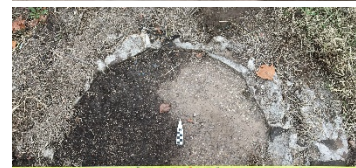

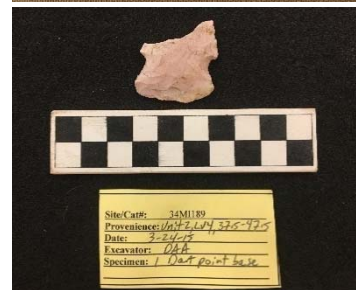

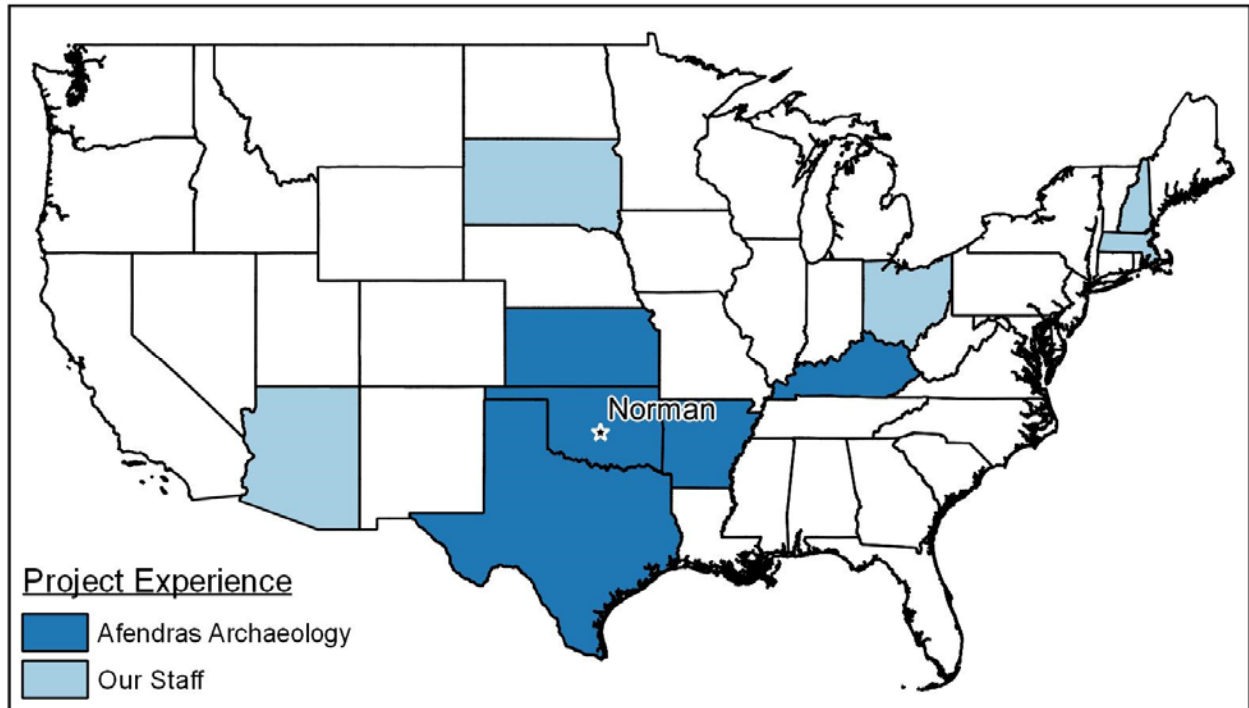
